Application method

Examination applications can be made only via the internet. Please apply from the JNEC website (https://www.nail-kentei.or.jp) Access the website from either the URL or QR code shown above. Be sure to submit your application and pay the required fees within the application period. For group applications, please refer to the website. (Group applications are available for groups of 10 or more people from the same corporation.)

Lottery

Because of the limited capacity of the examination venue, if applications exceed the venue's capacity, examinees will be selected from among applicants via a random lottery. Applicants who miss out in the lottery for this examination will be eligible to sit the Nailist Examination 2024 Autumn for Level 1 and Nailist Examination 2024 Summer for Levels 2 and 3. Please note that such applicants are not eligible to sit any alternative examination other than that stipulated and are not eligible for a refund. (Notice as to whether or not a lottery will be held will be posted on the JNEC website around mid-March.)

Payment

Final confirmation of applications is issued after payment of the examination fee has been completed. Applications will be void if payment is not made. The examination fee can be paid by either credit card or convenience store payment (must be paid within three days after completion of registration). Check your convenience store payment slip number on the screen after the application has been completed. The JNEC does not send payment forms to applicants. The examination fee will not be refunded for any reason, except in the event the examination is canceled. In the event that the examination is postponed, the examination fee will be applied to an alternative examination. Examinees with exemption from the written examination cannot receive a discount or refund.

Models

For the practical examination, examinees require either a model or JNEC certified model hands.  
\* If you select "Bring JNEC certified model hands," please personally prepare for the JNEC certified model hands. Moreover, if you take an exam using JNEC certified model hands, we recommend that you prepare them in advance for the application.

Changes

Cancellations and changes in choice of examination level,venue,model/modelhands selection,etc. will not be accepted after the application period has passed.

## Handling of personal information

The personal information (including sensitive information) of those applying to sit for the examination (hereinafter referred to as "Applicants") is used within the scope necessary for implementing the examination applied for and to the extent necessary for achieving that purpose (securing a seat in the examination venue etc.). Furthermore, this personal information is to be gathered using legal and fair methods. As a rule, the organizer of this examination, the Japan Nailist Examination Center (hereinafter referred to as the "JNEC") may not disclose personal information gathered from applicants to a third party without the written consent of the applicants. After conclusion of the examination, the JNEC or a group commissioned by the JNEC may contact applicants to provide information about future examinations or other JNEC activities via direct mail, telephone, or e-mail. If you do not want to be contacted in this way, please contact the JNEC.

# Examination precautions

**No questions regarding the examination are accepted.  
Be sure to carefully read the examination guidelines.**

## Precautions when coming to the site

Before the preliminary review begins, take a seat together with your model, or alternately, prepare your JNEC certified model hand and take a seat. The examination cannot begin until the examinees are all seated.

1. Application for the exam on the day of the exam will not be accepted, no exceptions. Examinee and his/her model, who have completed certain application procedures, may enter the exam site. Examinee may not be substituted. Children or pets are not allowed to enter.
2. Maintenance of the environment may be difficult according to the weather/season. Please be dressed appropriately so you can adjust to the room temperature as sensory temperature varies among people.
3. Examinees must take public transport to come to the exam site. No illegal parking, junk parking, pick-up car parking near the exam site, store parking lot, or open areas. (However, this excludes those who need assistance.) On the day of the exam, allow enough time for arrival to the exam site because there can be a delay in public transport due to weather and other factors.

## Points to consider at the exam site

1. The practical examination and the review are both lengthy examinations. If you wish to go to the toilet during the examination, please obtain the examiner's permission.
2. You cannot take the skills or written exam only. (Excluding examinee exempt from written exam.)
3. There is no reception counter. Please check to be sure that your seating position is correct. It is your responsibility if you sit in the wrong seat.
4. Please take trash home with you. Do not use spaces outside of the examination venue (including restaurants etc.) to prepare for the examination or nail off.
5. Only a watch is acceptable as an accessory around the hands during the skills exam for both examinee and model.
6. Examinee's nail may be of any coloring, but keep in mind that it should be appropriate as that of an examinee. Also, please make sure that your hair style does not interfere with the examination, such as hair falling down the front or side of your head during the examination.
7. Do not take the examination question sheet or answer sheet out of the examination venue.
8. Eating, drinking, and smoking are prohibited in the examination venue. However, it is permitted to hydrate (drinking water or tea from PET bottles).
9. It is not permitted to use smartphones, mobile telephones, PHS phones, smart watches, or other multifunctional electronic devices inside the examination venue (even if the device is being used as a clock). Furthermore, it is not permitted to film or record (using a smartphone, mobile telephone, camera, or tablet etc.) inside the examination venue.
10. Unauthorized reproduction of the official workbook of the Nailist Certificate Examination, including copying, scanning, and digitizing, is prohibited by the Copyright Act. Therefore, bringing such a reproduction with you into the exam site is not permitted.
11. Inside the venue there may be inspections or photographing/filming by news media. In the event that filming/recording takes place and images are distributed, this will be carried out in accordance with the Act on the Protection of Personal Information.

## Items required for taking the examination

- ☐ Examination admission slip (be sure to attach a photograph)
- ☐ All tools necessary for taking the practical examination (bring extra materials and tools at your own discretion.)
- ☐ Writing utensils (pencils or mechanical pencils [HB or B], eraser [that erases well])
- ☐ Indoor shoes (May be necessary depending on the venue. Please be sure to check your examination admission slip.)

\*No tools or equipment can be borrowed. For the written examination, please do not use a ballpoint pen (including erasable pens) or felt-tip pen.

## Cancellation of the examination due to a contingency situation

It is possible that the examination may be canceled because of any difficulty in securing the examination venue due to a contingency situation (typhoon, earthquake, tsunami, or other natural disaster, strike, or viral epidemic) or other circumstances, such as a blackout or traffic/communication/distribution congestion. Notices of cancellation are posted on the JNEC website, so please be sure to check.

Please note that in some cases, depending on the scale of the disaster, phones may not be connected. Follow-up after the cancellation of the license exam will be announced accordingly. We will not be responsible for the examinee's inconvenience, expenses (excluding exam fee), or any other personal damage caused by the cancellation of the exam.



## Basic skills and knowledge on nail care and nail art.

 Scope of questions: hygiene and sterilization / nail composition (dermatology) nail diseases and problems (physiological anatomy of nails) / nail care procedures  
 Language selection: Choose from Japanese, Chinese (Mandarin), Korean, and English at the time of application.



**Pass criteria** Practical examination: 38 points or higher (out of total score of 50 points)  
 Written examination: 80 points or higher (out of total score of 100 points)

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Models will not be allowed if it is found that their nails or the skin around their nails are diseased.</li> <li>The base for models' nails must be natural nails, but extensions (including virtual) or repairs (including glued on) up to two nails are acceptable. However, the color and shape must match that of the natural nails. When using nails with extensions/repairs, be sure to report this during the preliminary review.</li> <li>Do not file or clean cuticles for at least one week prior to the practical examination.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use right/left certified model hands with JNEC certified labels attached.</li> <li>Prior to the examination, attach JNEC certified nail tips with JNEC certified loose cuticles attached to the ten fingers in an appropriate manner. 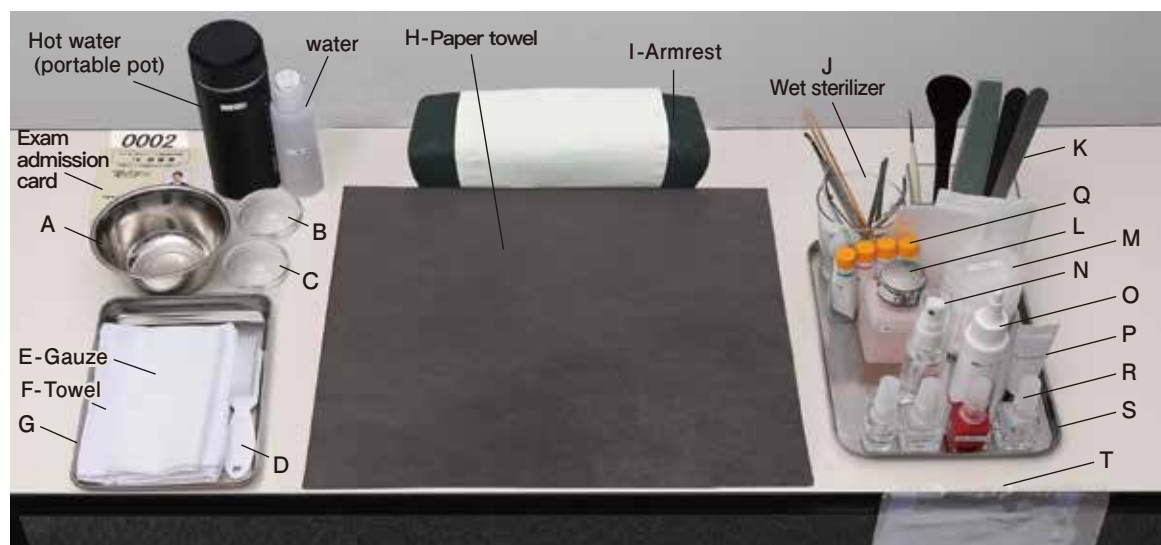
# Table setting rules and important notes

## Table setting & disinfection management

### Sanitized tools and materials must be organized and placed.

- Refer to the "Items where product labeling is mandatory" for the third level and label the products. Label must be easily visible. Alphabetical notation is not allowed.
- When you enter the venue, spray the ethanol that you brought with you on the paper and disinfect your table and chair and the model's chair before being seated. Similarly, disinfect your table and chair and the model's chair before leaving the venue. (Disinfecting wipe may also be used.)

## Table setting rules (Level 3)



A : Finger bowl  
B : Water for nail care  
C : Water for art  
D : Nail brush  
E : Gauze  
F : Towel  
G : Tray (only Gauze, Towel, Nail brushes are placed)

H : Paper towel  
...Set up so that the size covers the workspace in front of the arm rest  
I : Armrest  
...Wrap in paper towels

J : Wet sterilizer  
(Containers that can be altered by a disinfectant cannot be used.)  
K : Files .. Must be placed in the file stand  
L : Polish remover  
M : Cotton ... Use a container with a lid.  
N : Disinfectant ... Ethanol for disinfection, or other disinfectant solution  
O : Liquid soap  
P : Cuticle remover or cuticle cream  
Q : Materials for art (paint, brush, and pallet)  
R : Polishes  
S : Tray (Place only material and tools.)  
T : Trash bag

\*Hot water and water are not mandatory

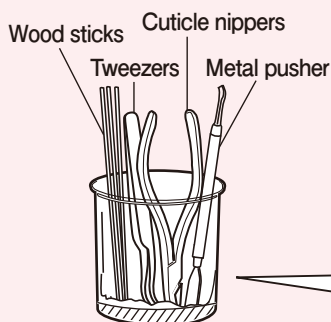
**[ Prohibited tools and materials ]** Examinees will be disqualified if they include any of these tools/materials in their set up.

- Nail machine
- Oils
- Art stickers
- Dot pens (marbling tools)
- Other nonregulation tools or materials

### Important notes

- All the materials and tools of the following A to T must be included in the setting.
- Water for A, B and C, hot water and water to refill do not have to be placed on the tray.
- Use nail products and cosmetic products.
- There is no designated manufacturer/brand for the tools and materials.
- Use towels (F) and paper towels (H) without patterns.
- Trays, finger bowls, and other containers must be made of plain plastic, glass, or metal that can be sterilized. Those made of wood, paper, and cloth cannot be used.
- Mesh bottom trays cannot be used.

### [ Tools to be always included in wet sterilizer(J) ]



Wood sticks / tweezers / cuticle nippers / metal pusher

\*You will be disqualified if you fail to include any of the above four items.

\*If you bring a nail nipper (or other nippers), place it (them) in the wet sterilizer.

\*Wood sticks wrapped in cotton are not allowed.

Lay [cotton or gauze] and pour disinfectant solution up to where the tip of the nipper will be covered. If protection pad for the tip is used, place cotton or gauze over it.

### Items that product labeling is mandatory for:

\* Product labeling is for clarifying the content

### Level 3

Wet sterilizer, cotton, disinfectant, polish remover, liquid soap, cuticle remover or cuticle cream, base coat, color polish, top coat  
(Note) Label the product when using pre-primer.

Scope of questions: history of the nail / hygiene and disinfection / nail structure (dermatology) / diseases and troubles of the nail (physiological anatomy of the nail) / procedures of nail care / types of repair and procedures of tip and wrap / overall practical treatments / professionalism etc.


